TEACHING SESSIONS

April is the month when new session commences in the government school. School enroll new children to the schools. In April, 5 children from Flying Birds were registered in the government school to further continue their education.

11 Children out of 16 enrolled in Flying Birds regularly attended the school. 6 Children went on leave as they had to visit their native villages. Classes on Mathematics, English, Hindi and other subjects were held.

CRAFTS, DANCE AND GAMES SESSIONS

Craft, dance and games sessions continued in Flying Birds. Teachers select the children for different extracurricular activities based on their (children's) interest and provide them opportunities to bring out their hidden talents. Children play different indoor and outdoor games with great interest.



Success Story

Priya is a girl aged 18 and lives in the Basti. She is the elder sister of Pooja and Kajal who are already enrolled in Flying Birds. Priya never attended any school before and her only daily routine was to look after her younger brothers and sisters. She also got involved in labour work and assisted her parents to increase the family's income.

Priya had an interest in craft work. She would purchase the craft material with the money she earned from labour work and prepare different items. When Priya learned about the Flying Birds from her siblings and met the Teachers there, she decided to improve her skills and learn new things. She has also started attending the education sessions and learnt the basic reading and writing skills. Although, Priya does all her routine chores as usual but she never forgets to devote some time for her study. She no longer wants to be an illiterate. She is also entering into a married life soon.

MID-DAY MEAL AND REFRESHMENTS

For the past two months nutritious refreshments are also being provided one day in a week basis to the children along with regular mid-day meal. Fruit juice is prepared at the school itself to ensure the freshness and preservation of nutritious ingredients.

HEALTH CAMP

Health screening camp was conducted in Flying Birds on 30th April. Total 20 children, 8 boys and 12 girls were examined in the camp. 3 Children were having allergy issues while 6 children reported the problems like joint pains. No health issues were found in 11 Children.



Due to regular health checkup camps and health education, the health seeking behaviour is also changing among the children. Now they pay more attention to their health issues and also don't hesitate to visit RDI to consult their problems with the doctor.
