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Teaching sessions

There were 22 children enrolled in the Flying Birds School in the month of February. Regular teaching classes were conducted by the teachers. In the month, 3 children dropped out from the school as they left for their native village. All 8 children continued their study in regular government school.

Crafts and Dance trainings

Ms. Shikha continued her crafts and dance trainings for the children. It was ensured that every child participate in extra-curricular activities as per his/her interest. The children also prepared their performances for SRHU Foundation Day to be organized in March.

Sports Activities

Sports are an integral part of the school education which contribute to the overall development of the children. Flying Birds also provides opportunities to children to have exposure on different games. Children were engaged in different indoor and outdoor games and activities. Ludo, puzzle games, carrom board, football and other traditional games are which children like to play.

Day Celebrations and Cultural Events

Holi Celebration



Festival of colours "Holi" was celebrated on 28th February with a lot of enthusiasm by the children in the school campus. The children used dry colours (gulal) to paly Holi and applied these to each other and had a lot of fun. On the occasion the children were educated on using the natural colours. In the end everyone enjoyed the gujiyas and sweets.

Mid-Day Meal

The fresh and nutritious mid-day meal was continually served in the school. After regularly practicing hand washing before eating, it has come into children's day to day habit and now they do it on their own without any force or instructions. Saying prayer before having food to express their gratitude to almighty has also become one of the regular features of their activities during the day.

Health Camp

In February, the health camp was conducted in the school on 24th. A team of a doctor, pharmacist and staff nurse examined each child in the school.

Total 18 children were examined during the camp. These 18 children, 11 boys and 7 girls, were thoroughly examined for cough and cold, abdominal pain and weakness, dental, fever and other ailments. 2 Children were found suffering from cold and cough, and 1 each for ENT and toothache problem. 4 children were found having problems like injury and joints pain. Other 10 children were found having no health issues.
