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Teaching sessions

There were 21 children enrolled in the Flying Birds school in the month of January. Regular teaching classes were conducted by the teachers. Due to winter vacations in the regular government school, the children enrolled there also joined Flying Birds for some days. The teachers in supervision of their Supervisor adapted the regular government school syllabus for Flying Birds also. In January no drop out was reported from the school. However, from government school 6 children, 2 boys and 4 girls, out of total 14 children dropped out as they left for their native places.

A yearly activity calendar has also been developed which features all the activities like academic assessments, workshops, important days to observe and cultural and sporting events.

Day Celebrations and Cultural Events

Apart from regular teaching classes, the children celebrated the New Year and Basant Panchami festival in the school. The school also participated in the national youth week and road safety day on 14th January and the Republic Day on 26th of January. Their beautiful performances were appreciated by the audience.

Mid-Day Meal

The fresh and nutritious mid-day meal was continually served in the school. The habit of washing hands before eating the food was ensured.

Health Camp

One of the important activities in the school is regular monthly health checkup of the children. A team of doctor, pharmacist and nursing staff visits the school on the last Saturday of the month and examines the each and every child thoroughly. The parents of the children also consult their problems and get health counseling. The general medicines are also provided during the health camps.

In January, total 19 children, 9 boys and 10 girls and 9 parents were examined. Cough and cold, abdominal pain and weakness were the major ailments observed among the children. Among adults, joints pain and skin related problems were mostly reported. RTI was also found among few women.
